Dr. Satyajit R. Patil, the IQAC coordinator, extended a warm welcome to Honorable Chairperson Dr. P. V. Kadole and all the other IQAC members.

Agenda Item No. 1: Confirmation of MoM of 23rd IQAC meeting and informing about ATR of the same.

- Dr. Satyajit R. Patil, Dean – Quality Assurance, reviewed the Minutes of Meeting (MoM) and the Action Taken Report (ATR) of the 23rd IQAC meeting, which took place on Tuesday, June 27, 2023. The IQAC members approved the MoM and engaged in discussions regarding the ATR.
- Mrs. Sarika D. Patil, Registrar – RIT, presented data on the Ph.D. qualifications of faculty members at the institute. She stated that 36% of the faculty members hold Ph.D. degrees. Furthermore, she mentioned that the institute allows faculty members to take study leave, whether on a part-time or full-time basis, to complete their Ph. D. as needed. Upon successful completion of their Ph. D., the institute offers three non-compounded increments to the faculty members in accordance with the 6th pay scale. The institute encourages the faculty members to register for Ph. D. under the QIP scheme. Few of the faculty members have availed the benefit of the same. She also informed that at the time of faculty recruitment, priority is given to Ph.D. candidates.
- Dr. N. V. Dharwadkar, Head – CSE, has conveyed that they have prepared and put into effect an action plan for the implementation of Outcome-Based Education (OBE).
- Dr. S. K. Patil, Dean – Academics, shared that the institute plans to collaborate with NITTTTR, Bhopal to facilitate faculty interaction and to organize workshops focused on enhancing faculty understanding and implementation of OBE (Outcome-Based Education). Subsequent discussions were held in relation to this initiative.
- Dr. A. P. Shah, Head – TPO, informed that orientation sessions for students have been organized and executed with the aim of increasing the number of students registering for the GATE examination. Furthermore, Dr. P. V. Kadole, Director – RIT has announced that students who qualify in the GATE examination, shall be reimbursed from the institute.
- Dr. M. B. Mandale, Head – Science & Humanities, conveyed that faculty members from the Science and Humanities Department are collaborating with faculty from Shivaji University, Kolhapur, Haryana, and Karnataka. Dr. M. S. Deshmukh, University Representative, emphasized the significance of collaborative work, highlighting that collaborative publications tend to enhance the publication count and the impact factor.



- Dr. M. S. Patil, Head-ETC, shared details about collaborative activities with IITB, including the reception of robots and drones.

Agenda Item No. 2: Brief about RIT's ongoing academic schedule and planning.

- Dr. S. K. Patil, Dean – Academics, provided an overview of the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 at the institute. He elaborated on the key highlights of the NEP and engaged in further discussions on this subject. The efforts made in this regard were appreciated by all the members.
- Dr. S. K. Patil, Dean – Academics, also discussed the academic activities planned for the year 2023-24, mentioning that all B. Tech, M. Tech, and M.B.A. programs commenced on the same date, which was the 21st of August 2023.

Agenda Item No. 3: To inform about the institution's admission status across the disciplines and programs.

- Dr. L. M. Jugulkar, Dean – Student Development, provided an update on the admission status of the B. Tech, M. Tech, and M.B.A. programs for the academic year 2023-24. It was discussed that B. Tech admissions have reached 112.61% of the target, while M. Tech admissions stand at 69.79%. Additionally, it was noted that RIT achieved 100% admissions for direct second-year B. Tech, with the exception of the Automobile Engineering program.
- Dr. L. M. Jugulkar, Dean – Student Development, also mentioned that we were unable to fill the seats for Foreign National Students (FNS) due to the early commencement of the academic year.

Agenda Item No. 4: To inform about the forthcoming NBA accreditation committee visit for UG and PG programs.

- Dr. Satyajit R. Patil, Dean – Quality Assurance, provided information about the upcoming visit of the NBA Accreditation committee, which will assess the UG program in Mechanical Engineering, and the PG programs in Power systems and Power Electronics, as well as Computer Science Engineering. He also delivered a presentation on the preparedness activities related to NBA accreditation which comprised of mock –accreditation exercises, one-on-one interaction with faculty members, and the evaluation of central facilities.



- Dr. M. S. Deshmukh, University Representative, emphasized that all preparations should align with the NBA requirement metric and extended best wishes to everyone for the NBA Committee's visit.

Agenda Item No. 5: To discuss and seek inputs for improvement in Central Library usage by students and teachers.

- Mr. V. L. Hase, Librarian – RIT, presented statistics of footfalls in the library for the previous academic years and additionally informed that the library has implemented RFID technology for tracking footfalls within the library. Subsequent discussions were held on this topic.

Agenda Item No. 6: To present the draft strategic plan of the institute for 2023-28.

- Dr. Satyajit R. Patil, Dean – Quality Assurance, presented the draft of the Strategic Plan of the institute for 2023-28 to all IQAC members to gather their insights and feedback.
- Honorable R. D. Sawant, Management Representative, informed the attendees that the Varne Harnish Model is being implemented to develop a five-year Strategic Plan, which is further broken up into yearly plans.
- Ms. Pallavi Korgaonkar, Industry Representative, highlighted the systematic approach used in developing the strategic plan and expressed her appreciation for it.
